Overlea High School Parent & Student Notification of Norms and Expectations 2018-2019

Greetings Overlea Scholars and Parents/Guardians:

The Overlea High School community values our scholars and our parents as we seek to embark on a partnership that ensures academic excellence for every Overlea scholar. Overlea High School prides itself in creating a safe and orderly learning environment for our students, teachers and staff members. As members of the Overlea community, it is vital that all scholars maintain a positive and healthy relationship within our school community. In addition, the Overlea staff believes that the success of our scholars is a shared responsibility between the school, parent, and student. It is the responsibility of all parties to ensure that the Overlea school community is a safe and secure learning environment that supports teaching and learning for all community members. To maximize student achievement and safety, Overlea High School personnel requests that parents/guardians partner with us to ensure your scholar adheres to the following norms/expectations:

I. Dress Code

Public schools do not regulate the dress and/or appearance of scholars unless the dress and/or appearance interferes with the educational process. Standards for scholar dress during the school day and during other school-sponsored activities are detailed in Board of Education Policy 5520 and Superintendent's Rule 5520, *Student Dress Code*. The student dress code is intended to outline acceptable standards for student dress during the school day and during other school-sponsored activities and events in order to preserve a safe and orderly environment that is conducive to learning. Students will wear attire in a manner that supports a healthy and safe learning environment. **Students will not wear attire that is disruptive to the school environment, promotes illegal or harmful activities, or that could endanger the health and safety of the student or other students, which includes but is not limited to that which:**

1. Depicts messages that are lewd, vulgar, obscene, plainly offensive, violent, sexually explicit, or that reference items that are illegal in general or illegal specifically for underage students;
2. Promotes use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products;
3. Contains sexually suggestive messages;
4. Depicts gang affiliation;
5. Causes or is likely to cause a substantial or material disruption to school activities or the orderly and safe operation of the school or at school-sponsored activities;
6. Contains rude, disrespectful, or discourteous expressions inconsistent with civil discourse and behavior.

Specifically, the following items are not permissible:

- bare feet
- headwear of any kind (except when worn for medical reasons or as a legitimate expression of a student's religious practice and faith and as approved by school administration)
- Jean with holes (e.g. to wear jeans with holes, students must wear tights underneath the jeans)
- Jeans/pants sagging off of the buttocks area
- **Revealing clothing or clothing designed to call undue attention to the body (i.e. torn or ripped clothing, excessively short shorts or skirts or midriffs showing, sagging clothes).**

II. Tardiness/Attendance to School

Scholars have the responsibility to comply with the attendance procedures detailed in Board of Education Policy 5120 and Superintendent's Rule 5120, *Student Attendance and Excuses*. A scholar absent from school shall present a note signed by the parent immediately upon return to school. If a scholar is absent for one of the lawful reasons (e.g. illness, college visits, death in family) teachers will assist the scholar in making up missed work whenever possible. The scholar has one week to make up missed assignments from the day of return. The scholar is expected to assume the responsibility for maintaining the continuity of learning regardless of the reason for absence. If a scholar is absent for an extended period of time because of illness, a written statement of explanation may be required from a physician on the day of the scholar's return to school. Repetitive absences may result in the following:

- Failure of a class

- Loss of points on an assignment
- Referral to project attend
- Required Parent Conference
- PPW referral

Scholars are expected to attend school in a prompt manner. The warning bell rings at Overlea High at 7:30 a.m. Scholars are expected to be in their classes, in their seats, no later than 7:45 a.m. Failure to be in class in a seat at 7:45 will result in an unexcused lateness. Scholars will not be permitted to 1st period without a pink pass from the tardiness team. Scholars who arrive after 7:45 a.m., must bring in a note with a lawful excuse (e.g. illness) in order for the lateness to be excused. If a student is tardy without an excuse for an extended period of time, the following consequences may occur:

- Detention
- Required Parent Conference
- Loss of points on assignments given in the class affected by the lateness

If a student is tardy due to illness for an extended period of time, a written statement of explanation from a physician may be required.

III. Use of Cell phones

Your scholar's success is very important to Overlea High School staff. Often cell phones are very disruptive to the teaching and learning environment when not used for educational purposes. Cell phone use is not permitted in classes during the school day. Cell phone use is only permitted during lunch time. Please encourage your child to not use the cell phone during the school day. In addition, please do not call your scholar or text your scholar during the school day. In the event of an emergency, please contact the main office at 443-809-5241 and an office associate will locate your scholar for you. Unauthorized use of the cell phone may result in the following consequences:

- Phone call home
- Confiscation of cell phone with the cell phone being only released to the parent/guardian
- Required parent conference
- Detention
- Out of school suspension (repetitive use)

IV. Entering the Building and Dismissal

Scholars will be permitted to enter the school building at 7:30 a.m. After 7:45 a.m., scholars must enter through the entrance at sunshine alley (e.g. downstairs entrance to the 1st floor). Dismissal for scholars is at 2:20 p.m. Scholars are only allowed to reenter the building from 2:20 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. Scholars are only permitted to stay at school for school related business including extracurricular activities, detention, and/or coach classes. Scholars are not permitted to leave the building at 2:20 and reenter after 2:30 p.m. without the permission of a member of the Overlea administrative team.

V. Outside Food

The Office of Food and Nutrition Services (OFNS) operates the Child Nutrition Program ensuring all students have access to healthy meals. Meals are available for purchase at published prices. Subsidized meals are available for those who qualify. Payment for meals is due upon service. Outside food items are not permitted at Overlea High school after 7:45 a.m. The delivery of outside food items by any companies and/or individuals to our scholars is not permitted at any time. Any scholar who violates this policy is subject to disciplinary action.

VI. Disruptive Behavior

It is important that we communicate the BCPS Policy and Superintendent's Rule 5550, *Disruptive Behavior* with you. The Student Handbook Orientation will be conducted by the School Administration and will outline and explain routines, regulations, and procedures that scholars are expected to follow. Scholars who violate the Code of Conduct will be subject to disciplinary action. We will **not** tolerate disruptive behavior, this includes **fighting, threats on individuals, or physical attacks**. Our explicit intent is to inform you that **fighting, threats, physical attacks, or disruptive behavior** will result in one or more of the disciplinary consequences below in addition to suspension or expulsion. The list does not represent the full range of disciplinary consequences:

- The student will be **excluded** from prom (**Junior or Senior**). This includes 9th and 10th grade students' future proms.
- The student will be **excluded** from participating in **homecoming** activities, including pep rally, games, and dances.
- The student will be **excluded** from afterschool activities and will be required to leave the school building and grounds upon dismissal unless approved by School Administrator to remain for educational purposes.
- The student will **not** be permitted to participate in **assemblies** or any other **school events** that occur during the school day.
- The student will not be permitted to participate or represent the school in **athletics or co-curricular activities, clubs, and organizations**.
- The student will not be permitted to attend any athletic games (home or away).

While many of our scholars exhibit excellent and respectful behavior, we must inform all scholars and parents/guardians of our expectations and the consequences as outlined in the BCPS Student Handbook and the Code of Conduct. We expect Overlea scholars to SOAR by exhibiting self-discipline, optimism, accountability, and respect.

We appreciate your support and partnership as we work together to ensure the safety, wellness, and academic excellence for every Overlea Scholar.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT OR INTIMIDATION REPORTING FORM

Directions: Bullying, harassment, and intimidation are serious and will not be tolerated. This is a form to report alleged bullying, harassment, or intimidation that occurred during the current school year on school property, at a school-sponsored activity or event off school property, on a school bus, on the way to and/or from school*, or on the internet-sent on or off school property; or that substantially disrupted the orderly operation of the school. Bullying, harassment and intimidation includes any intentional conduct, including verbal, physical or written conduct, or an intentional electronic communication, that creates a hostile educational environment by substantially interfering with a student's educational benefits, opportunities or performance, or with a student's physical or psychological well-being.

Definitions:

1. **Bullying** – A pattern or behavior when a person repeatedly uses power in an intentional manner, including verbal, physical, or written conduct or intentional electronic communication against one or more students.
2. **Cyberbullying** – The use of electronic communication to harm or harass others in a deliberate, repeated, and hostile manner.
3. **Harassment** – Includes actual or perceived negative actions that offend, ridicule, or demean another individual with regard to race, national origin, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, ancestry, physical attributes, socioeconomic status, familial status, physical or mental ability, or disability.
4. **Intimidation** – subjecting an individual to intentional action that seriously threatens and induces a sense of fear and/or inferiority.

Conduct that is of a sexual nature is generally thought to mean actions, language or visual materials which specifically refer to, portray or involve sexual activity or language. Conduct of a sexual nature may include overt sexual solicitations, inappropriate touching, sexual jokes, and inquiries about a person's sex life. Sexual harassment is the broader term that encompasses conduct of a sexual nature such as unwelcomed sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical contact of a sexual nature. Sexual harassment also includes acts that are not overtly sexual but rather are directed at individuals based on their gender such as profanity or rude behavior that is gender-specific.

If you are a student, the parent/guardian of a student, a close adult relative of a student, or a school staff member and wish to report an incident of alleged bullying harassment, or intimidation, complete this form and return it to the principal at the student victim's school. You may contact the school for additional information or assistance at any time.

Universal Emergency Response Procedures

What Parents Need to Know

Once an administrator calls for one of the universal emergency responses below, students, employees, service providers, and visitors are to immediately follow the procedures provided. Notification is to be given in an age-appropriate manner.

ALERT STATUS – For use in securing access to buildings, usually a community event.

When a school or office building is under alert status, no one can enter or leave the building without the principal's or office head's permission. This permission is granted on a case-by-case basis when it is safe to do so and usually granted in conjunction with approval by the Baltimore County Police Department (BCoPD). Parents should not come to a school while the occupants are on alert status as this might place them at risk by doing so while the event in the community is being investigated or handled by the BCoPD.

EVACUATION – For use when conditions outside are safer than conditions inside.

When a school's or office's occupants are told to follow their evacuation procedures, there is a condition within the building that makes it safer for them to be out of the building. Each school or office building has designated meeting locations for an evacuation with alternate locations, if necessary. Parents should not come to a school that has evacuated and remove students, as this can disrupt the accounting procedures that are in place.

DROP, COVER, AND HOLD – For use in earthquakes or other imminent danger to a building or its immediate surroundings.

When the drop, cover, hold response is called, occupants of a building will take cover away from windows or any areas that are likely to be affected. Parents should not come to a school while the occupants are under this universal response as this might place them at risk by doing so under the adverse environmental conditions that led to the response.

LOCKDOWN – For use in protecting building occupants from potential dangers in the building or outside.

When a school or office building is on lockdown, no one can enter or leave the building. Movement within the building is restricted and individuals within the building remain behind locked doors until cleared to move by first responders or the event is deemed over. Parents should not come to a school while the occupants are on lockdown as this places them at risk by doing so.

SEVERE WEATHER SAFE AREA – For use in severe weather emergencies.

When a severe weather response is called, occupants of a building will take cover away from windows or any areas that are likely to be affected. Parents should not come to a school while the occupants are under this universal response, as this might place them at risk by doing so under the adverse environmental conditions that led to the response.

SHELTER IN PLACE – For use in external gas or chemical releases.

When occupants of a building are told to shelter in place, they make every effort to seal the building from outside toxins by shutting down their air handling systems and blocking fumes from entering the building. Parents should not come to a school while the occupants are under this universal response, as opening doors will expose the occupants to the outside toxins of concern.
